# FERGUSON TOWNSHIP PLANNING COMMISSION

Special Meeting Tuesday, May 31, 2016 6:00 pm

### I. ATTENDANCE

The Planning Commission held a special meeting on Monday, May 31, 2016 at the Ferguson Township Municipal Building. In attendance were:

## II. CALL TO ORDER

Mr. McMaster called the meeting to order.

### IV. YOUNG SCHOLARS SCHOOL

Mr. Stolinas stated at the regular meeting of the Ferguson Township Planning Commission held on May 23, 2016, members deferred making a recommendation on the application due to three concerns: Account for the potential 500 student occupancy at the school in the Traffic Impact Study, include the proposed intersection at Blue Course and Park Center Blvd. in the Traffic Impact Study and consideration of the Pick-Up/Drop-Off loop driveway width, which is currently proposed at fourteen (14') feet. On May 24th, Planning & Zoning staff met with representatives from Young Scholars Charter School, Robyn Froehlich, P.E., Stahl Sheaffer Engineering and Ron Seybert, P.E., Township Engineer to discuss the concerns. The applicants stressed the short window of opportunity to begin construction and requested a Special Meeting with the Planning Commission to further discuss these transportation issues and request a recommendation for the June 6th Board of Supervisors meeting. It was also discussed that the currently approved Traffic Impact Study accounts for no more than a total of 384 students, or 40 additional students under this current Land Development Application

Mr. Stolinas stated the Planning Commission make a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors, based on the remaining Traffic Impact Study items discussed at the May 23, 2016 meeting, to APPROVE the Young Scholars of Central PA Charter School - Second Story Addition Land Development Plan, submitted on April 12, 2016, last revised May 26, 2016, condition upon the remaining comments.

Mr. Homan stated he was concerned the traffic study did not include the traffic impacts to Blue Course Drive. He noted a few areas of the traffic study he did not understand the results.

Ron Seybert, Township Engineer, stated other projects with in the study area which overlapped this study area did not include Blue Course Drive. He stated the area which was included in the traffic study was the entrance on to Westerly Parkway. He stated operationally staff did not include Blue Course Drive because the number of trips does not meet the requirements during peak hours.

Mr. Crassweller stated he believes there is a problem with the number of students which creates an increased amount of traffic. He said there are safety concerns with staff and children coming and going into this entrance. He asked what the documented occupancy was the school. Mr. Ressler answered the occupancy is not a zoning concern and zoning is concerned with is parking which is based on the maximum square footage of the mulit-purpose room which is the largest space in the school.

Mr. Levant Kaya stated the school does not intend to exceed 384 students.

Mr. Harcom asked if there was an increased enrollment or who would monitor that student enrollment. Mr. Keough answered they report the enrollment to the State College Area School District.

Mr. Wheland stated the drop off lane of 14 feet seems wide since it is only one traffic lane. Ms. Schoch stated plantings will be planted to deter drivers not to pass. She added the width of the lane was determined by Rob Watts and the increased width is due to the loading and unloading of children.

Mr. Seybert stated the drop off and pick up will work well if the parents follow the rules and be patient.

Mr. Scott stated he is aware of a resident complaint that cars where turning around in their driveway after dropping off their children. He also stated he would like the parking agreement between the church and the school be increase for 10 years. Mr. McMaster asked if the school moved out of this location would the parking agreement no longer exist. Mr. Ressler answered the applicant has adequate parking for this land development plan the agreement is only for extra parking. He added the Township has no control over the parking agreement the school has with the church.

Mr. Keough stated he believes two "No passing" signs are needed because of the width of the lane in the drop off area a small car could pass a parked car. Mr. Wheland stated he would like to see the area to be wider so a car could pass if necessary or make it narrow enough so they cannot pass.

Mr. Harkcom asked what the primary use was for the seven parking spaces in the unloading area.

Robin Froehlich of Stahl Sheaffer Engineering, LLC, stated they are for parking of staff because the parents drop off is closer to the multipurpose room at the back of the building.

Mr. Keough stated what will happen if the forth arm gets developed will there be a need for changes this intersection when that happens.

Mr. Seybert explained when the last Comprehensive Study was completed it was determined because of the land use that was projected when that happens there will be three lanes and it will have a dedicate turn left and right. Mr. Seybert at the intersection of Blue Course Drive and Westerly Parkway there are acceptable levels of service when it was studied two years ago. There was a discussion as to what criteria requires a traffic study noting specific criteria in the Township ordinance which triggers a traffic study.

Ms. Mitchell asked if a dummy sign such as the signal they have down town in front of the Alpha Fire Department. Mr. Seybert answered that signal at that location because it is a fire department was approved by Penn Dot and a school would not fit that criteria.

Mr. Scott asked if there would be parking issues if the school had a special event where all parent attended. Mr. Kaya, CEO of Young Scholars School, answered the school staggers the special events to different nights so not all parents are there at one time.

Mr. Kaya stated the school did everything they could to abide by all the Township rules and requirements. He also stated he would like be meet the construction deadline of June 10, 2016 and get a permit for this project.

Mr. Crassweller made a motion to recommend APPROVAL of the Young Scholars School with all conditions to the Board of Supervisors. Mr. Scott seconded the motion. The motion carried.

# V. ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Crassweller made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Ms. Homan seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

With no further business, the May 31, 2016 special Planning Commission meeting was adjourned at 7:00 pm.
