- RPOS Plan was last updated in 2009


> RPOS Plan Update (2022) will encompass:

Playground 1	Good	5-12 Years	No	Surrounding slopes makes access difficult, turn radius at the entrance not suitable for wheel chairs, lack of accessible play equipment, few pieces of ADA enrichment.	
No Mow Zone	Good	All	Yes*	Seems to be properly maintained for the assessment time of year, access/experience from compliant trail.	
Basketball Court	Good	All	Yes*	Gravel trail is rugged and needs maintenance. 84'-4" post to post, Over run area is 4' wide at most. Questionable location for a bike rack.	
Gravel Paths	Fair	All	Yes*	Gravel trail is mostly rugged and needs maintenance. "8' wide, but varies due to vegetation encroachment, etc.	
Pavilion	Good	All	Yes*	Gravel path leads to it, but sections are too steep.	
Playground 2	Fair	5-12 Years	Nο	Paths do not connect. Mulch needs replenished behind swings and to ensure proper depth.	
Port-a-potty	Good	All	No	Well maintained, however, no ADA access.	
Drinking Fountains^	Good	All	Yes	Well maintained and completely accessible.	
Park Benches^	Fair	All	No	Park benches do not have companion seating and are often setback from the paths.	
Trash Cans^	Fair	All	Yes*	A slight mix of old style and look-a-like, upgraded replacements. Most off of the path making them inaccessible.	

General Notes: A check is needed on the number of parking spots for large gatherings.

PARKS, RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE

- The Township should adopt a minimum set of standards for parkland development. The recommendations for minimum development of parkland are:
 - Each park which has been only partially developed should be fully developed to meet the master plan recommendations.
 - Each park which has not been developed should have a master plan completed and development started in incremental stages.
 - c. During the master planning process the Township should ensure that there is an appropriate mix of active and passive recreation areas in each park to meet the needs of the park users. In addition, the public should be actively involved in determining the facilities that are constructed within the park.
 - d. The minimum facilities within each park should include a playground, picnic area, active recreation area and a park trail that connects to adjacent bikepaths.
 - The facilities planned in each park should be flexible in use (ie. Dual soccer and ballfield)
 and should be able to be converted to meet changing needs.
 - The Township should provide CIP funding each year to develop portions of the parks.
