

## Protecting our Air, Water, & Natural Areas

### Ferguson Township's Green Infrastructure Policy











If you have driven down Whitehall Road, you may have noticed that the Ferguson Township Municipal Building has some new vegetation on its property. While it may look like unkept grass with weeds from afar, up close, it is an intentional ecosystem that has a positive environmental impact on both rainfall and our native wildlife.

Known as bioswales, these channels are built into the ground to transport water and have the secondary purpose of removing debris and pollution. Here at the Ferguson Township offices, our bioswale begins near the new Public Works building on Research Drive and runs down Whitehall Road, ending in the southeast corner of the site.

A bioswale is one example of green infrastructure that has been implemented in Ferguson Township. Green infrastructure refers to an interconnected network of open space consisting of natural areas and other green features that protects ecosystem functions and contribute to clean air and water. Green infrastructure is an evolution of the typical "gray insfrastructure", systems of gutters, pipes, and tunnels, that communities have used to manage water.

The Township continually receives requests by residents, staff and the Board to convert passive areas within parks such as Cecil Irvin Park, Fairbrook Park, Tudek Park and Haymarket Park into green infrastructure areas.

Ferguson Township recognizes the importance of maintaining the condition, accessibility and safety of its naturalized environments which is why the Green Infastructure Policy was adopted. The focus of this policy is to establish a procedure on how to process requests and how to better maintain the condition and safety of the naturalized environments within Township Parks.

Now, residents can submit requests to Ferguson Township to evaluate a proposed park to implement green infrastructures such as meadows, grow zones, & pollinator gardens & plots.

### **New Board of Supervisor Member Sworn In**

During their regular meeting on Tuesday, September 7, the Ferguson Township Board of Supervisors appointed Pam Steckler to the recently vacant Ward II Board of Supervisor position.

Former Board Member Prasenjit Mitra had to resign his position due to no longer living in Ferguson Township. The Board had thirty days from the effective date of the resignation, August 2, to appoint a qualified individual as provided in Article II of the Home Rule Charter to fill the seat until the next municipal election. The Board of Supervisors conducted interviews for potential applicants during a Special Meeting and selected Ms. Steckler to fill the position, which she will serve until December 31, 2021.



Per the PA Election Code, Centre County will notify the political parties and request a nominee from each to face off in the November General Election (Section 979). This means that this year's election will include two vacant At-Large seats, and one vacant Ward seat. The winner of the Ward vacancy will serve the remainder of Mr. Mitra's unexpired term (two years) and will then be eligible to seek re-election to serve for an additional full term.

Ferguson Township greatly appreciates Ms. Steckler for filling the Board's vacancy.

## **Recreation, Parks & Open Space Plan Update**

During their regular meeting on July 19, the Ferguson Township Board of Supervisors awarded a contract to consulting firm Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc. (HRG) to update the Ferguson Township Recreation, Parks, and Open Space (RPOS) Plan.

The RPOS Plan provides a long-term outlook and vision for Ferguson Township parks, recreation facilities, and open space. The update will drive near-term and long-range planning, ensure Township parks provide recreational opportunities for all members of our community, direct decision-making, and resources toward a defined vision for the future. The Township's RPOS Plan was last updated in 2009.



The Parks and Recreation Committee held a kick-off meeting with staff, Committee members, Nichole Mendinsky, HRG Project Manager, and her team. The group discussed and reviewed project scope, proposed schedule, goals for the plan, and public engagement process.

The public is invited to attend Parks and Recreation Committee upcoming meetings to receive updates and get involved on the master planning process for RPOS Plan Update.

## 2022 - 2026 Capital Improvement Plan Adopted!

The 2022 - 2026 Capital Improvement Plan was adopted by the Board of Supervisors during their September 7 regular meeting.

The Ferguson Township's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) outlines plans for capital expenses of \$2,500 or more with a life span of more than one year, including such projects as buildings, roads, and the purchase of major equipment and vehicles.



Some exciting projects highlighted in the CIP are the Playground Safety and Contingency Program; the Saybrook/Greenbriar Park Master Plan; the Pollution Reduction Plan; and Park Hills Drainageway;

Next up for the for the Finance Department is the Operating Budget. The Operating Budget is a one-year look at the future and is an official budget for the Township. Departments will provide their budgets by the end of October to be reviewed by the Township Manager and Finance Director. The Board of Supervisors will review in the middle of November during Special Meetings. The Budget will then be adopted in December.

## Apply for a Short Term Rental Today!

With Football season just around the corner, there is no better time to get your property set up for a short-term rentals with a permit!

Here in Ferguson Township, property owners are permitted to operate short-term rentals with some restrictions. The regulations are intended to balance the economic opportunity created by Short Term Rentals with the need to maintain the Township's housing supply and protect the right and safety of owners, guests and neighbors.



By permitting this type of use, the Township's goal is to balance the economic opportunity created by Short Term Rentals with the need to maintain the Township's housing supply and protect the rights and safety of owners, guests and neighbors. The short-term rental must provide one off-street parking space per bedroom available for rental. It is important to remember that short-term rentals are subject to enforcement of the Township's noise, nuisance and property maintenance related ordinances.

Ferguson Township requires a permit prior to operating a Short Term Rental and a one time fee of \$25 with the submitted application. Application packets can be found on our website in the Planning & Zoning Department under "Applications, Forms, & Permits". Please contact the Zoning Administrator in the Planning and Zoning Department at (814) 238-4651 to obtain a permit.

## **Sign Ordinance: Political Signs**

November is around the corner and with that local Municipal Elections! Residents will soon be displaying signs on their properties supporting their favorite candidate.

Under the Ferguson Township's Sign & Billboard Ordinance, Political Signs are considered "personal expression signs" which are permitted in the Township and don't require a sign permit. Residential lots may have up to three temporary signs in the yard.

Signs are prohibited in the Township's Right-of-Way, the area between the sidewalk and street. Alternatively, if there is no sidewalk, it is typically the area between the utility poles and the street.

## **Protect Yourself From Scams**

Phone and cyber crimes have been on the rise in recent years, especially social security and unemployment scams. The Ferguson Township Police Department has received multiple calls from residents regarding scams with gift cards. Here are a couple of tips from our Police Department to better protect yourself:

- Do not pay anyone in gift cards such as iTunes cards;
- Think twice before paying someone over the internet;
- Do not answer calls from unknown numbers or hang up immediately;
- If a government agency or company calls and asks for personal information, tell them you'll contact them on your own (Use the customer service number listed on their website or bill). Do not use the number provided by the caller.
- If you have elderly family or friends, talk to them about common scams and teach them to protect themselves.
- NEVER give out personally identifiable information (PII) such as account numbers, social security numbers, email addresses, or driver's license numbers.

## **School Bus Stopping Law**

The State College Area School District is back in session as of Tuesday, August 24th and the local police departments of the Centre Region would like to remind residents of the traffic laws for school buses.

More buses will be on the roadway this year than last, so please do your part to keep our students safe. If you are ever uncertain what to do when you see flashing yellow or red light, safely come to a stop.

In Pennsylvania, it is illegal to pass a school bus when its red lights are flashing and stop arm is extended. Motorists must stop at least 10 feet away from school buses that have their red lights flashing and stop arm extended. Offenders will face a \$250 fine, 5 points on their driving record, and a 60-day license suspension.

Each School bus in State College Area School Districts is equipped with cameras to ensure the safety of its children. Any violations will be recorded and sent to the police for prosecution. Here are a couple of rules to follow developed by PennDOT:

## **Stormwater Credits & Exemptions Due September 30**

The Ferguson Township Stormwater Fee will be applied on property owners' tax bills in spring of 2022. As part of the Stormwater Management Utility Ordinance, property owners are encouraged to review credits and exemptions that are available to reduce their stormwater utility bills.



The Agricultural Properties Partial Exemption Policy allows properties that meet the definition of "agricultural use" & have less than 30 percent impervious coverage to apply for a partial exemption.

This exemption limits the maximum fee assessed to twice the median assessment fee imposed on all other properties in the Township. Each residence on the property is also assessed one Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU).

The Non Profit Exemption Policy provides a full (100%) exemption from the stormwater utility fee to an organization exempt from taxation, or would qualify from exemption from taxation under § 501(c)(3); § 50.1(c)(13); or § 501(c)(19) of the Internal Revenue Code and assessed an annual stormwater utility fee payment that equals or exceeds one percent (1%) of the organization's total (taxable or non taxable) annual revenue prior to deductions for applicable credits or exemptions.

The Economic Hardship Policy provides a full (100%) exemption to individuals and families who earn less than or equal to two hundred percent (200%) of the Federal poverty Income Level by household size as defined by the US Department of Health and Human Services. A fifty percent (50%) exemption shall apply to individuals and families who earn less than or equal to two hundred and fifty percent (250%) of the Federal Poverty Income Level by household size as defined by the US Department of Health and Human Services.

Property owners can reduce their stormwater fee up to 40 percent by applying for various credits as outlined in our Stormwater Credit Manual. Some of these include adopting an inlet, disconnected downspouts, & turf nutrient management.

To be considered eligible, property owners must apply by September 30th of each year and receive approval status for a partial/full exemption. Exemptions and credits are NOT automatically applied to any property and must be applied for every year. Credits will continue to renew annually subject to the credit feature being maintained and functional.

## **Protecting Our Water Quality**

Do you know where your stormwater goes? When it rains, pollutants from pet waste, cars, and lawns can find their way into our streams and groundwater through stormwater runoff. You can help protect our streams and groundwater by minimizing these pollutants. Since 2003, Ferguson Township has been required to participate in a Federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) mandated program for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4).



The purpose of this program is to control the inflow of pollutants into the Township's storm sewers and drainage ditches. Products such as oil, antifreeze, detergents, litter,

animal wastes, fertilizer, pesticides and sediment from erosion can be washed into the storm drain system during rain storms or by melting snow. Eventually this untreated storm water flows into our streams and aquifers and can impact water quality.

The MS4 program contains six measures designed to reduce these "nonpoint sources" of water pollution. Two of these measures include public education and public participation. It is important that all of us recognize our role in protecting the environment. Steps you can take to help protect water quality include:

- Never dump automotive waste materials or used household products into a storm drain, anywhere on the ground or in a basement sump pump. Report any other similar activities that you observe.
- Always use household and lawn care products in accordance with instructions and dispose of excess material properly.
- Wash your car at a commercial car wash or in a manner that wash water drains into lawn areas to be filtered into the ground and not onto the street.
- Avoid long term exposure of uncovered soil stockpiles, establish vegetation to prevent erosion.
- Clean up pet waste and dispose in a method that will prevent introduction into storm sewers and ditches.

The Township continues to implement the other programs related to; monitoring for illicit discharges, inspecting stormwater facilities, monitoring construction activities, and implementing good housekeeping practices.


