The Centre Area Transportation Authority (CATA) provides public transportation for Ferguson Township residents via Centre Line and The Loop. The CATA Board of Directors is responsible for determining transit policy, preparing operating budgets, approving routes, scheduling, setting and adopting fees, and supervising staff operations. Ferguson Township's CATA Representative serves on the Board for a five-year term. The CATA Board of Directors meets monthly.



Township Provides 24/7 Tree Emergency Response

With the arrival of winter storm season, the Township experiences an uptick in unpredictable tree failures. These failures are often hazardous and cause disruptions that need to be mitigated. Fortunately, the Township has a 24/7 tree emergency response protocol to ensure these tree emergencies are addressed in a timely manner.

A tree emergency can be defined as an imminent threat to public safety or infrastructure that is time sensitive. Trees blocking or threatening safe use of public rights-of-way including roads, bike lanes or sidewalks must be abated. Other tree hazards include partially failed trees or uprooting/leaning trees that threaten the roadway below. It is especially important that downed trees do not hinder access for emergency service vehicles.



The Township's Public Works Department is well trained and outfitted to respond to various types of tree emergencies. Once an emergency is reported, a team of responders is dispatched immediately and can mitigate the hazard in a very short time. All debris from Township owned trees is removed. If a private tree falls onto the right-of-way, Township staff will clear the roadway and remove debris within reason. The remaining debris will be neatly stacked on private property for the adjacent property owner to dispose of.



As part of Ferguson Township's **2023 Operating Budget**, the Township plans to resurface a portion of Blue Course Drive between Circleville Road and Martin Street and implement some mobility improvements that were recommended in the Northland Area Mobility Study that was completed in 2019. The design for these improvements will be completed in-house by Township staff for construction this summer. The street will not be closed during construction, but lane restrictions and delays can be expected.

The mobility improvements include constructing a median with a mid-block pedestrian crossing near the existing bus stop, as well as overhead lighting and a rectangular rapid flashing beacon (RRFB) to warn motorist of pedestrian crossing activity. Coordination with CATA will occur regarding bus boarding area improvements to be implemented with this project. Further mobility improvements may be completed in future years as recommended in the mobility study as funding becomes available.

- Pearls of Wisdom from a Stormwater Engineer -



The **previous article** in the *Raindrops* series reviewed the watersheds in Ferguson Township, our location at the headwaters of two of the Major Chesapeake Bay Sub Watersheds (Juniata and West Branch of the Susquehanna), as well as how impacts to headwaters are sometimes not as visible locally, as they are downstream in a watershed. Stormwater from Ferguson Township ultimately ends up in the Chesapeake Bay. Check out this **map of our local watersheds**.

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Update on Terraced Streetscapes District Rewrite

Mackin Engineers & Consultants presented an update on the Terraced Streetscape District Rewrite at the Board of Supervisors meeting on Tuesday, January 17, 2023.

The Terraced Streetscape District (TSD) is a mixed-use corridor along West College Avenue (State Route 26) from the boundary of State College Borough (Buckhout Street) to the intersection of Blue Course Drive. This district provides for a mix of commercial and residential uses meant to be promoted at a pedestrian scale.

While the rest of the Township experienced significant development over the last decade, the TSD has not developed as envisioned. Mackin was hired by the Township for the Terraced Streetscape Ordinance Rewrite Project, and after holding public meetings and a design charette, their presentation at the January 17 Board meeting showcased multiple options for the redesign.

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Public Hearing on Telecommunications Facilities Ordinance Amendment Request

At the Board of Supervisors Regular Meeting on January 3, 2023, the Board received a draft amendment to Chapter 27, Zoning, Section 710—Wireless Communications Facilities.

The goal of the proposed amendment is to update the code to reflect technological advances since this ordinance was last amended in 2015 and to resolve digital disparities within the Township that COVID-19 exposed.



The Board tabled the amendment and requested additional information from staff that was presented at the January 17, 2023 meeting, after which, the Board authorized to hold a public hearing prior to giving consideration to the amendment of the ordinance. The public hearing will be held at the next Board of Supervisors meeting scheduled for Tuesday, February 7, 2023.

Reminder to Clear Snow on Sidewalks



Since the first snowstorm of the year, our Ordinance Officer has given out many citations due to residents failing to remove snow and ice from sidewalks. The Planning & Zoning Department would like to remind residents of Ferguson Township's Sidewalk **Snow Removal Ordinance**.

From October to April, property owners are responsible for clearing the **full width** of the sidewalk along their property **within 24 hours** after snow or ice fall has stopped. This includes clearing dedicated paved streets within apartment complexes.

If there is a violation, the property will receive a written notice of warning. The violation must be corrected within 24 hours and failure to correct the violation will result in additional notices and appropriate fines. Continued offenses can lead to legal action.
