The Township advertised the vacant at-large role, and ten applicants were interviewed at a special




Ferguson Township 2023 Budget Review

Township Manager, Centrice Martin, presented the Ferguson Township Proposed 2023 Operating Budget to the Board of Supervisors in two special meetings on November 9 and 10.

The draft budget is now available to the public for review. The Board will be taking public feedback at the first Board of Supervisors Regular Meeting in December, which is scheduled for Tuesday, December 6.

The budget will then be finalized and approved at the second Board of Supervisors Regular Meeting in December on Tuesday, December 13.

Fall Leaves Can Be a Nutrient Resource for Your Yard

Every autumn here in Central Pennsylvania we celebrate the fleeting tapestry of colorful leaves along the ridges and in our backyards, only to begrudge having to rake them when they fall to the ground in November. But do we need to rake all of those leaves?

According to **Penn State Extension**, while "ecologically speaking you do not need to rake leaves, a heavy layer can smother your lawn grass and prevent new growth in spring. Compacted leaves can promote snow mold diseases that damage turf grass."

Extension suggests that the easiest way to treat leaves on your lawn is to "pass over them with a mower a few times to shred them into small pieces. This method will return nitrogen to the soil as the chipped leaves decompose. In the garden, you can leave them where they fall, so they help insulate plant roots. Composting leaves is a great way to recycle nutrients." Alternately you can rake them into a pile and use the lawn mower to shred them to add to flower beds.

If mulching still isn't for you though, Ferguson Township offers curbside brush and leaf collection from April through December. See this <u>link</u> for pick-up dates and a YouTube video for how to prepare your collection to help ensure the safety of our crews.

Brush & Leaf Collection



Cold weather is on its way, but there is still time to clear your property of remaining leaves and brush.

There is one final round of brush collection to start the week of December 5. Place your brush curbside by 7am on Monday, December 5 and our crew will be around to collect it as they make their way through your neighborhood.

Leaf collection will continue daily until December 12 or winter weather / winter

operations being (whichever comes first). Please be sure your leaves are in loose piles by the curb by 7am on Monday, December 12, as that will be the final leaf collection until spring.

Township Ordinance Reminders



Remove Political Signs

Political signs must be taken down within five (5) days following an election.



Short-Term Rental Permit

You must have a permit if you wish to rent out your property. Permit numbers must be displayed in the rental property's window and advertisements must list the permit number.



No Parking on Certain **Streets**

All vehicles parked on a public roadway must park with traffic and have current registration and inspection. Streets



Snow Parking Reminder

Following a snowfall accumulating two (2) or more inches, all vehicles must be removed from the streets. Vehicles that remain on the street will be ticketed and/or towed.



Keep Dogs on Leashes

The Tudek Dog Park is the **ONLY** off-leash area in the Centre Region municipal parks system. Otherwise, all municipal parks require dogs to be on a

Township Police Speak at Media Event Addressing Agressive Driving



In partnership with PennDOT and the Highway Safety Network, Ferguson Township Police participated in a media event on Wednesday, November 9.

The event highlighted the efforts of law enforcement during a statewide high visibility aggressive driving enforcement wave. The event took place near the intersection of Blue Course Drive and West College Avenue, State College

Ferguson Township's Sergeant Ryan Hendrick gave an overview of Pennsylvania's Move Over Law, which requires drivers approaching an emergency response area to either merge into a lane farther away or slow down. He discussed the legal consequences of being convicted of a violation and the danger these violations pose to motorists and emergency responders. Sergeant Hendrick also offered tips with visual cues on how and when motorists must comply with this law.
