# **Public Works News**



### New GIS Administrator - Corina Fernandez

We warmly welcome the newest member of our Public Works team - Corina Fernandez. Corina has taken on the role of GIS Administrator.

As a GIS administrator, she will support all Public Works Department projects and direct technical work. Among other duties, she will coordinate GIS activities, manage geospatial databases, analyze data, and design digital maps.

Her background includes experience in research, education, and management. She has a BSc in Agricultural Engineering and a MSc in Regional Planning, with over 15 years of experience working with a range of GIS applications.

### Oak Wilt Pruning Moratorium to Be Lifted November 1st

With fall finally arriving to the Centre Region, the Township will be lifting its oak pruning moratorium from November 1 through March 31. The moratorium is currently in place to minimize the spread of oak wilt.

Oak wilt is caused by a fungus that clogs the water and nutrient conducting system of oak trees. All oak trees are susceptible; however, mortality is more prevalent in red oaks. Once infected, an otherwise healthy tree rapidly drops its leaves during the summer months and dies while adjacent, non-infected trees, still have green leaves.

Over time, the disease can spread to nearby oak trees through root grafting or long distances by sap-feeding beetles that carry the fungal spores to new trees.

Fortunately, **Township Resolution 2016-32** provides Township staff with an aggressive management strategy to mitigate the spread of oak wilt within the growth boundary and outside the growth boundary within R1 and RR zones. Infected trees are removed immediately and all trees within a 150 foot radius are treated with fungicide to prevent the spread to surrounding trees. This service is provided at no cost to the property owners within the treatment area.

Residents with oak trees on their property are urged to remain vigilant and routinely look for signs of oak wilt. Early detection is key to minimize the spread. Ferguson Township experienced one confirmed case in 2022.

Please note:

- It is unlawful to prune oak trees from April 1 through October 31, when beetles that spread the fungus are active.
- It is unlawful for individuals who work on your trees to use tree climbing spikes at any time of year, except for the purpose of removing the tree.
- Climbing spikes can open up wounds that make it easier for beetles to spread the fungu.

### Raindrops

- Pearls of Wisdom from a Stormwater Engineer -



Welcome to Raindrops, a new section of the Newsletter where we will review stormwater and water resources-related topics in Ferguson Township.

This month's topic: Watersheds- more specifically, surface water watersheds in Ferguson Township.

Surface waters are any body of water above ground, including streams, rivers, lakes, wetlands, and reservoirs. Bodies of water may be:

- **ephemeral** (containing water only for short times or during rainfall events producing stormwater runoff)
- intermittent (containing water during seasonal daylighting of the water table)
- **perennial** (containing water year-round)

### Ferguson Township's surface waters

Ferguson Township is located at the headwaters (the highest source) of two of the six major sub watersheds of the Susquehanna Basin/Chesapeake Bay- the Juniata River and West Branch of

the Susquehanna.

On the west side of the Township, surface waters drain to the Juniata River via smaller tributary streams including Beaver Branch, Halfmoon Creek, Warriors Mark Run as well as the main branch of Spruce Creek. Spruce Creek drains to the Little Juniata River which drains to the Juniata River. The eastern half of the Township drains to the West Branch of the Susquehanna via tributary streams including Slab Cabin, Big Hollow and Thompson Run – all of which drain to Spring Creek. Spring Creek drains to Bald Eagle Creek which drains to the West Branch of the Susquehanna.

Rainfall, absorbed into the ground and/or generating runoff from roofs, streets, driveways, lawns, farm fields and forest, provides the source for surface waters.

### **Downstream impact**

Residents of Ferguson are lucky to live in the headwaters. For the most part, we don't experience any significant negative cumulative impacts on our water resources from upstream sources.


Folks who live downstream are impacted by upstream practices. As a resident, consider how source water, which is generated when rain falls on your property, may be impacted by your practices. Do you apply excessive fertilizers or herbicides to your property? Is your car leaking fluids? Do you blow leaves or grass into the street? Are you washing your car in a driveway connected to a storm drain system?

While these examples may seem minor on an individual level, the collective accumulation of such practices can have a significant negative impact on downstream surface water. If you have ever enjoyed walking down Spring Creek Canyon, fishing or floating on Spring or Spruce Creek, or boating on the Juniata or in Bald Eagle Lake, keep in mind that we are a part of those watersheds as you enjoy the beautiful world out there.

### Find your watershed

Can you find which watershed you live in on the map below? Now find the red line (approximated based on WRR 48-1980) on the map. While the majority of Ferguson Township's surface waters drain toward the east end of the Township, groundwater on the northeast side of the red line flows to the Spring Creek Basin (contrary to surface flows). Where does your ground water drain to? Adding to this natural wonder, a significant portion of stormwater runoff does not make it to streams via surface flows, rather draining directly into local aquifers via Karst geology ("sinkholes"). More on Karst in the future!

### Signs, Signs Everywhere

As the General Election approaches, you may notice more and more signs appearing in yards promoting residents' favorite candidates.

While signs of personal expression are permitted, we would like to remind everyone where they can

and cannot be placed.

The space between the sidewalk and the street is the Township right-of-way. Signs may NOT be placed in this space. In areas with no sidewalk, this is generally the area between utility poles and the street.

Signs may be placed on the property owner's side of the grass with a limit of three (3) signs per residential property.
