When "spring cleaning" includes carpet cleaning, dispose of carpet wash water properly.

Carpet wash water may contain many toxic chemicals that we are trying to prevent from entering our environment. Heavy metals, grease, oils, and detergents may be lurking in that wash water. Always consider contaminated waste water as hazardous material and dispose of accordingly.

To dispose of waste water properly:

• Before cleaning, vacuum to minimize debris in the wash water.

· Empty wash water down a sink, toilet, bathtub or shower drain. If a septic system is in place, collect wash water and take it to a sewer discharge point.

 Manage detergents and chemicals: Store and mix them inside so spills don't enter storm drains, roadways or ditches.

• Determine where to dispose of wash water. Never dump wash water nto a storm drain or ditch.

• Filter all wash water: Fibers and other debris in the wash water can clog pipes.

• Dispose of most filtered materials in the garbage, which is allowed unless the waste is contaminated.
