Baileyville Community Hall is an historic former tworoom school house which still serves as a community gathering place today. The school building originated in 1895, or 1901, and then switched to a Community Hall in 1932. Now, 81-years later, the Hall is used as a gathering place for wedding receptions, baby

Included in the Summary is a breakdown of cost-per-resident which illustrates each resident's contribution to township and regional

services. For example, if you were ever wondering about what it costs for police services, the total cost of Public Safety per resident is \$158.72 in 2014, including both operating and capital expenditures. Residents may <u>read the Summary online</u>.

Brush and leaf collections continue during the winter months. It is the *intention* of the township that brush and leaf collections continue on their normal pick-up schedule: Starting the first Monday of every month, or the following day if it is a holiday, *as weather permits*. But, during these winter months,

sometimes brush and leaf collections will have to be delayed so public works crews can instead concentrate on snow removal and road treatment, or even because piles are covered with snow and ice (pictured).
