Brush Collection advisory: Be aware of utility boxes



The Public Works Department uses mechanical equipment to assist with our curbside brush collection. With that in mind, please place brush greater than 10 feet away from cable or electric utility boxes that may be located in your front yard near the roadway. Placing brush on or within 10 feet

of these boxes increases the risk that they will be damaged by our equipment. To ensure our workers' safety and prevent damage to equipment, Public Works employees are unable to pick up brush piles that are placed too close to utility boxes. Thank you for your cooperation.

Drop off your grass clippings here

Ferguson Township Public Works will take your grass clippings to the State College Borough recycling and composting facility if you bring them to us. Feel free to drop them off from dawn to dusk, seven days a week, at the municipal building, 3147 Research Drive. Look for the "Grass Drop-Off" signs.



Streetlights not working? Let us know so we can help ensure your safety

You can help ensure safe streets for our pedestrians and vehicles by letting us know when streetlights are not working properly. Please notify township staff at 814.238.4651 or by e-mail at contact@twp.ferguson.pa.us. You can also use the Contact Us form on our website.

In addition, First Energy-West Penn Power maintains any streetlight that isn't working and will repair it within 3 - 5 days. If lightbulbs are working but lights don't turn off during the day, its maintenance team will replace or repair the sensor. Simply phone, fax or report the problem online at www.FirstEnergyCorp.com. The Federal Highway Administration's <u>new requirements for</u> <u>retroreflective signs</u> are designed to make streets safer by making them highly visible to drivers. The deadline to replace existing signs with those in compliance -- originally scheduled for January 2015 -- has been lifted, but homeowners associations may want to consider budgeting for replacement signs when they are able. HOAs are asked to advise the Ferguson Township Public Works Department when they are ready to incur the cost of purchasing the new signs and an additional fee if Public Works will be installing those signs. As an added precaution, the Ferguson Township Police Department can help by checking on your house while you're away. <u>It's easy to arrange</u>.

Before you leave town, fill out the department's online form with your address, emergency contact information, your departure and return date, and the make and model of any vehicles you'll be leaving in your driveway. You can also note whether you'll be leaving your lights on a timer and a spare key with a friend or neighbor in case of emergency. Provide that person's contact information on the form.


