Ferguson Township is currently seeking applicants for the position of Director of Planning and Zoning. Ferguson Township is a vibrant, growing community located in southwest Centre County, Pennsylvania. The municipal boundaries cover several areas, including State College, Pennsylvania Furnace, Pine Grove Mills, Rock Springs, and more. The Township has been a Home Rule Municipality since 1974, and is considered a full-service community to the approximately 19,000 people who call the Township home.

Ferguson Township includes part of the Penn State University campus and, as a Town/Gown Community, faces the same challenges and opportunities that other university towns around the nation do, but also captures the small town and rural atmosphere that exemplifies central Pennsylvania.

Grow Zones are designated areas that will not be mowed regularly to help provide natural and diverse habitat areas that bring environmental, educational and cost reduction benefits. Ferguson Township encourages residents to complete a survey on the new Grow Zone at Fairbrook Park. Learn more...

are no-mow or low-mow areas designated to help Centre County maintain biodiversity in the environment and reduce our carbon footprint.

Local parks play an important role in maintaining a high quality of life for community members and the biotic community of the natural world. Maintaining a healthy relationship between these communities exhibits good stewardship that can benefit future generations.

Fairbook Park will play an important role in demonstrating good stewardship opportunities that can be applied to other parks as well as private landowners.

Ecological Benefits

- Grow Zones allow surrounding landscapes to achieve a higher diversity of plant material that host a diverse selection of insects.
- A higher diversity of insects provides high amounts of protein and energy for songbirds, such as the Eastern Bluebird, to feed their growing young during the nesting season.
- Grow Zones allow a soft edge next to wooded areas that help songbirds, owls, and many other wildlife species to find food and nesting opportunities.

Educational Benefits

- Grow Zones can educate and empower community members to promote soft edges in the landscape at their own homes.
- A diverse landscape can provide an outdoor classroom with Citizen Science opportunities to encourage learning about science.

Water Quality Benefits

A high abundance of herbaceous plants such as Common Milkweed, Black-eyed Susan, and grasses help keep rainwater in the nearby soil and prevent soil erosion.

Cost-Saving Benefits

- Fuel cost reductions
- Labor cost reductions

Township receives PADEP grant to add electric vehicle

Ferguson Township is among the recipients of a Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) grant for clean vehicle projects throughout the state. The Township has been awarded a \$7,500 grant to acquire an all-electric vehicle from the DEP Alternative Fuels Incentive Grants (AFIG) program, which supports the replacement of natural gas vehicles as well as the installation of a charging station.
